ABOUT THIS BROCHURE

This brochure¹ was designed to offer guidance to those wishing to carry out university studies in our country. With this purpose, the Argentine higher education system is briefly described and general information and contact information is listed for all our institutes and universities. Immigration requirements for international students are provided, together with details on studying Spanish and how to obtain official certification in Spanish as a foreign language. Finally, this brochure provides useful general information about Argentina.

WHY STUDY IN ARGENTINA?

Argentina is an increasingly attractive destination for foreign students. It is a multicultural country with a wide variety of cities, places to study, and places to visit. In recent years, there has been an exponential growth in the arrival of foreign students, which is mainly due to the following factors:



-The **academic excellence of Argentine Universities**. All Argentine universities and institutes are subject to periodic evaluations by the National Commission for University Evaluation and Accreditation (CONEAU); and their courses are accredited by this commission and overseen by the Ministry of Education.

-The **low costs**: both the cost of living as well as tuition fees. National public universities don't usually charge for undergraduate studies, while private universities have considerably lower tuition costs than in other countries. Argentina is a better option, with respect to price, when compared to countries with similar levels of culture and education.

-The opportunity to **learn Spanish as a foreign language**. A wide variety of courses are offered: short-term and intensive courses, annual courses, or courses in specific areas geared towards business, specific professions, tourism, or academia. Another strong reason for studying Spanish in Argentina is the possibility of obtaining official certification (**Certificate of Spanish Language and Use – CELU**), awarded by a consortium of 20 national public universities and recognized by Argentine governmental resolutions. It is a standardized test that is currently administered in Argentina, Brazil, France and Germany.

-The **variety of cultural and touristic offerings**. Argentina is the 8th largest country in the world, has a wide variety of climates, from the Southernmost city in the world, Ushuaia, in Tierra del Fuego, to the subtropical jungles in the Northeast, to the Andes Mountain Range, with the highest peaks in the world outside of the Himalayas, the legendary Pampas, and Patagonia. Its largest cities, such as Buenos Aires, Córdoba, Mendoza, Rosario, La Plata, and Salta, attract students because of their culture, sophistication, variety of activities, opportunities, and landscapes.

UNIVERSITY HIGHER EDUCATION

The university education system in Argentina has a complex and heterogeneous institutional structure, made up of more than 100 universities and institutes, where one can work at an undergraduate and postgraduate level or study a variety of specific courses or programs. These institutions have more than 1,600,000 undergraduate students and more than 80,000 postgraduate students .

The short degree programmes, (or) technical degrees and diploma courses, generally take between two and three years, and offer intermediate or final degrees. The undergraduate programmes include licentiate degrees, teaching degrees, and professional degrees in areas such as medicine, law, engineering, and others. Finally, postgraduate programmes can be specializations, masters or doctorates, and include a wide range of disciplines. They generally have tuition costs and some universities offer scholarships for foreign students.³

Institutions called "Universidades" or "Universities" have academic activities in a wide variety of disciplines, and are organized into schools, departments, or equivalent academic units, while institutions that limit their academic offerings to one specific area (art, medicine, aeronautics, technology, health, business administration, among others) are known as "Institutos Universitarios" or "Institutes".

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The technical degrees and undergraduate degrees offered by Argentine universities and the corresponding national recognition of the degrees awarded, are subject to the official certification system offered by the Argentine government through the Ministry of Education.

On the other hand, those undergraduate programmes that affect the public's interest by directly putting at risk their health, safety, rights, property or education, will also be required to be accredited on a regular basis by the National Commission for University Evaluation and Accreditation (CONEAU), or by authorized private entities created for this purpose.

The CONEAU is a public and decentralized organization, working under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Education, whose goal is to guarantee the quality of universities and institutes through systematic processes of evaluation and accreditation. It evaluates all universities in the country and issues recommendations on projects to create new universities. It carries out its work with the participation of renowned academic partners.

With respect to postgraduate programmes, which can be Specializations, Master's or Doctorate's degrees, they must be periodically accredited by the CONEAU.

On the other hand, universities and institutes must ensure the existence of an internal institutional evaluation process which should be carried out within the framework of each institution's objectives, and should be done periodically, but at a minimum, once every six years.

Additionally, some Argentine universities and institutes voluntarily accredit their programmes and are externally evaluated by renowned international organizations





IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR UNIVERSITY STUDIES IN ARGENTINA

People entering Argentina as tourists, regardless of their country of origin, can study at Argentine universities without changing their immigration status, as long as those studies end before the finalization of their legal residency awarded upon entering the country.

If the studies last longer than their residency period, case 1 or 2 applies:

Case 1. Immigration Regime for Citizens of Countries WHO DO NOT NEED A VISA to enter Argentina as a tourist

Citizens of countries who do not require a visa to enter Argentina as a tourist can study at a university by entering as a tourist and obtaining their student residency status within thirty days of registration. To obtain this permission, they must present proof of admission to an Argentine university, which they may have obtained from their country of origin, or while in Argentina. Their university will explain the procedure and the necessary documentation.

Case 2. Immigration Regime for Citizens of Countries WHO NEED A VISA to enter Argentina as a tourist

Citizens of countries who require a visa to enter Argentina as a tourist, must request their admission to an Argentine university from their country of origin; this university will then request the National Immigration Office for authorization for the student's entry. With authorization for entry and admission to the university, the students must request their visa in their country's Argentine consulate. Their university will explain the procedure and the necessary documentation.

RECOGNITION OR REVALIDATION OF DEGREES

In order to register as a student in undergraduate programmes in Argentine universities, one must present a duly legalized certificate indicating completion of secondary school. Nevertheless, some universities allow students to register, and then obtain a recognition or revalidation⁵ of their high school degree. Non-degree-seeking students are exempted from seeking recognition or revalidation of their secondary school degrees.

To carry out postgraduate studies, recognition or revalidation of a student's university degree is not necessary unless it is one of the following Specializations: Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing, Psychology or Biochemistry. For other programmes or postgraduate courses, presenting a duly legalized university degree from one's country of origin is sufficient.

SPANISH IN ARGENTINA

The choice of Argentina as a place to study the Spanish language is growing year by year. Between 2006 and 2007, the number of students grew from 17,000 to 25,000.

The number of places to study have also grown and include, in addition to universities, Spanish language institutes all over the country that frequently offer options to help students find Accommodation as well as the opportunity to participate in other activities (volunteer work, tango classes, sports, rural tourism, adventure tourism, or medical tourism).

Certificate of Spanish Language and Use (CELU)

A strong motive for studying Spanish in Argentina is the existence of an official certificate (Certificate of Spanish Language and Use – CELU) offered by the Interuniversity Consortium for the Evaluation of Knowledge and Use of Spanish as a Foreign Language, which includes 21 national Argentine universities.

The CELU is the only exam officially recognized by Argentina's Ministry of Education and Ministry of Foreign and Religious Affairs. It is recognized internationally by the Brazilian and Chinese governments. CELU certificates can be presented as proof of Spanish language competence in businesses or teaching institutions. The exams evaluate correct use of the language, but do not take into account teaching ability. Thus, they do not offer any accreditation as a teacher of Spanish as a foreign language.

The certificate includes the candidate's name, document number, and nationality, together with the exam date, the exam level (Intermediate or Advanced) and the level of distinction (Good, Very Good, Excellent).

CELU has 2 levels: Intermediate and Advanced.

Intermediate Level

An Intermediate Level Spanish Speaker can converse with a certain degree of fluency in familial, social and service-related situations, while they may struggle in unknown contexts or when faced with the need to describe subtle concepts or when having an in-depth conversation. They can communicate acceptably in work and academic situations.

This level is considered the threshold for university studies.

Advanced Level

This speaker is able to converse comfortably and spontaneously in a wide range of familial and social situations. He or she can communicate adequately in work and academic situations.

Currency

The Argentine currency is the peso (\$). The bills in circulation are \$100; \$50; \$20; \$10; \$5 and \$2. The coins in circulation are \$1; 50 centavos; 25 centavos; 10 centavos and 5 centavos.

The U.S. Dollar is the most widely used foreign currency. Foreign currencies can be exchanged showing your passport in banks or authorized exchange houses.

Value Added Tax (IVA)

In Argentina, it is 21%.

Tax free

To recover IVA from tax free products, one must save the receipts from purchases and fill out the appropriate form that can be obtained at the airport.

Accommodation

Argentine universities do not generally have dormitories or student residences for foreign students, but many do offer guidance regarding Accommodation possibilities.

There are many options, such as renting apartments, individual rooms, staying in student residences or family homes, with or without the owners' presence.

Argentina is the second largest country in South America and the eight largest country in the World. Its total surface area is 2,791,810 km² and borders on the north with Bolivia and Paraguay, on the Northeast with Brazil, on the East with Uruguay, and on the South and on the West with Chile.

Climate

Argentina has a wide variety of climates: moderate and humid on the Pampa plains, cold in Patagonia, the country's Southern region, and subtropical in the North. From November through March, the country's average temperature is 23° C, and from June through September, the average temperature is 12°C.

Tourism

Argentina's extensive territory has many wonderful tourist attractions. Argentina is the second most visited country in South America after Brazil, and the fifth most visited country in the Americas. Tourists come mainly from Brazil, Chile, Peru, Colombia, Mexico, Bolivia, Ecuador, Uruguay, the United States, Venezuela and Paraguay, with Europeans mainly coming from Spain, Italy, France, Germany, England and Switzerland.

Buenos Aires is known as foreign tourists' favorite downtown. They are attracted by a fast-paced, heavily populated, cosmopolitan city with great culture and good infrastructure. Among other factors, the tango leads to many visits not just to Argentina's capital city, but also to the rest of the country. The characteristic porteño nightlife often surprises new arrivals with its wide variety of cultural, gastronomic and entertainment offerings.

The Iguazú Falls are located in Misiones Province. In 1984, they were declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. This impressively beautiful landscape, as well as the varied and abundant flora and fauna present, have made this location one of the most well-known and beautiful tourist centers in the world.

Salta and Jujuy provinces include some of the main well-preserved pre-Hispanic urban centers in South America, as well as the Quebrada de Humahuaca, which was declared a World Heritage Site. These provinces have easy, paved-road access to Chile and Bolivia.

Glaciers are one of the main attractions of Argentine Patagonia. The most well-known glacier is Perito Moreno, whose accessibility and periodic calving make it especially interesting. It extends over the waters of the Southern Branch of Lago Argentino (Argentine Lake), it is 5 km. wide and has a height of between 60 and 70 meters above water level. This majestic wall of ice covers 230 square kilometers. The area of continental ice formations and glaciers are a natural treasure declared a World Heritage Site by the UNESCO in 1981.

Other attractive tourist areas include: Mar del Plata and the Atlantic Coast in the Buenos Aires Province (especially frequented by Argentine tourists in summertime); the mountains of Córdoba, snow-covered Bariloche, and Mendoza's vineyards.
